"Sum Up Practical Experiences, Enforce Well the 'Three Fixings, One Replacement' Labor System by the Pol.Dep/+ of the 6th Engineering Bureau of the Bldg.Construction dept.of the COP (Chien-chu (Bldg.Construction)#12,6/28/65

The cadres of our bureau have been regularly taking part in coll. productive labor for several years..... In the 2nd half of '64, the successove derectoves of the party center & Chmn Mao on codres' participation in coll. productive labor was examined. After repeated discussions, a decision was made on 2/26/64 concerning the practice of '3 fixings, I replacement' in respect to cadres' participation in collective productive labor. The decision was then transmitted from level to level in the downward direction, put into force. The bureau was also called a conf. of all its cadres to carry out mobilization. The '3 fixings, one replacement' labor system was then enforced throughout the bureau. Our principal practices were as follows:

(1)Firm & swift action, education by deeds and words.

1st the leadership took the lead & set examples.....Like the workers, they did whatever they were told to do....The principal results we have obtained are as follows:

(1) The cadres' thought has been better remolded, the ties bet the cadres & the masses have been further strengthened & prod.has been advanced.....

At the same time, because the cadres set examples, with their own actio s & took the lead in laboring the vigor of the masses of the workers was stimulated, & prod.was advanced. We noil drums had to be sanded in Work Area No.2 of the installation corp., some wkrs.et lst did not want to do the job. The cadres then took the lead in doing it. Seeing this, the wkrs.also began to do the job....

(3)Cadres' participation in collective productive labor has become more regular &become more of a system. In the past, concerning cadres' participation in collective productive labor, specific regulations were locking as to labor time &labor posts. The cadres were free to arrive late &leave early. Some wkrs said, "This time, the cadres labor differently. There is a fixed slot for everything. Labor time & labor posts are fixed. Whoever he may be, he has to submit to job assignment by the team or goup leader when he is on duty...."

(c) Taborine with wkrs. While do not theer normal work, foremen & regulation personnel, who are in charge of many wk.points &long lines &whose duties are scattered, may take part together with wkrs., attending to weak links &key links of grod. &bearing

...(c) Laboring at fixed times. The bureau is to make a general rule, designating one full day or 2 ½ days a week as labor days for leadership cadres at the bureau &the office levels. In this way, labor time can be guaranteed, &association of labor with work can be faciliated.

Of all these forms of labor, the putting of individuals into separate groups as a means of enforcing the '3 fixings, one replacement' system is the principal one. The rest are subsidiary forms. In this way, it can be insured that every cadre will regularly take part in labor for a long time, &at the same time the characteristics of the work of some cadres can be looked after.


