CONFRONTATION BET. Daniel Cohn-Bendit & J.M. Catala, gen. sec. of Union of Communist
Students in front of packed auditorium on night of May 13 after massive march
when CP told their militants to disperse rather than join with students for
discussion at Champ de Mars. "A revealing answer," replied Cohn-Bendit, "the
orgs. hadn't foreseen that we would be a mln. in streets. But life is bigger than
the orgs. With a mln. people almost anything is possible. You say the Comm. hadn't
sanctioned anything further. On the day of the Rev., com., you will doubtless tell
us to forget it 'because it hasn't been sanctioned by the appropriate sponsoring
comm.'"

p.23 "On the 1st day abn, Renault, Citroen, Air France,
Boussac, the Nouvelles Messageries de Presse,
Rhône-Poulenc, & the RATP (Metro) were contacted, then the movement
snowballed."

p.24 "More & more wks. dropped in to draft joint leaflets with the students.
Soon there was rm. big enough for the daily 'Assemblees Generales'. The
students learned a great deal from the wks. self-discipline & from the systematic
way in which they presented their reports. It was all so different from the
'in-fighting' of the pol. sects. There was general agreement that these were
the finest lectures ever held at Censier!"

Q of leaflets from: AIR FRANCE: "We refuse to accept a degrading 'modernisation'
of our affairs. Like the students, we must take the control of
our affairs into our own hands."

RENAULT: "We must now struggle for a fundamental change in
society. As wks. we should ourselves seek to control
the operator of our enterprises. Our objectives are
similar to those of the students."

RHÔNE-POULENC: "The action of the students has shown us that
only rank and file action could compel the authorities to retreat... We should
decide the purpose of prod...."

"Every day dozens of such leaflets were discussed, typed, duplicated, distributed.
Every eve. we heard of the response: 'The blokes think it's tremendous... Some say
let's push all together now & take the lot. The leaflet certainly started the
lads talking. They've never had so much to say. The officials had to wait
their turn to speak!..'"

Then comes exposure of CP betrayal & Trotskyist etc. Plus "conclusion: ~~not~~
This has undoubtedly been the greatest rev. upheaval in W.E. since the days
of the Paris Commune..." Then, after stressing it happened in Fr., "not in some
underdeveloped country" proceeds to blow horn for itself based on E. Morin giving
Soc. ou Barb. credit, ~~against~~ IS's attack on Cardan, but mentions nothing that IS
got Voix Ouvriere, tho that is listed as having issued pamphlet, etc. etc. concl.
"One doesn't get beyond bur.org. by denying all orgs...." Action or thought?
For rev. socialists the problem is not to make a synthesis of these 2 preoccupations
of the rev. students. It is to destroy the social context in which such false
alternatives find root."
