First of all let me thank you very much for your critique of Bell's End Of Ideology, It was most illuminating and although I have not read the whole of Bell's book, the brief intrusion I made through it left me with the impression of complete dissatisfaction. The title itself is enough to flabbergast one!

Bess played us the tape recording of your interview with a radio station here and both myself and my wife were most impressed that you were able to give real expression to a concept of Marxism which most of the people especially we in Africa have never considered. (There has been so much Marxist and anti Marxist propaganda in the world with Africa getting more of the latter that people have either rejected Marxism on the strength of what goes on in Russia especially under Stalin or accepted it on the same basis. Humanist interpretation cannot had its chance to be heard.) While I am not a Marxist myself I cannot but express admiration for the interpretation of the Marx by the humanist movement in this country. I can well imagine you retorting that the Humanist movement is not an interpretation of Marx but an expression of the real spirit of Marx which has been distorted and twisted over the years by the people of Moscow and Peking! I can judge this from your writings.

I am sending you the first two issues of the UNIP newspaper for which we are desperately seeking aid.

I look forward to hearing from you and possibly seeing you in the near future.
