The Tenant Management Programme All Residents of Regent Park

The use of Laundry room facilities March, 7, 1977.

The R.P.C.I.A. Through the Tenant Management programme has assumed responsibility of all Laundry Rooms in Regent Park, on the 1st, May, 1976.

During this period we have observed that (a) Tenants are sending their children under 14 to do the laundry, this is wrong. NO CHILD UNDER THE AGE OF 14 YEARS is permitted to use the machines. (b) Machines NOT be OVERLOADED as this causes serious breakdown of services. (c) The hours of operation should be observed because Laundry Attendants DO NOT GET PAID FOR

WORKING OVERTIME. (d)Tenants should NOT use abusive language to the Attendants, and should NOT attack them as has happened on several occassions in some buildings. (e) Rugs, Carpets and other heavy materials SHOULD NOT be washed in machines. If you have a problem speak to your attendant or call my office at 364-8902 and I am sure your problem will be given attention.



LINES AND SHAPES




When you draw you show you are simply using lines to make shapes and here are the basic lines.


STRAIGHT -BROCKEN WAVY CURLY



Now here are a few examples of what you can do with these lines.










Wavy and Straight
