### About Us

The history of New Hogtown Press can be traced back to the literature distribution service operated by the Canadian Union of Students.

During the dissolution of CUS in 1969, a group of people decided to maintain this service as an independent organization named Hogtown Press. Hogtown made available many of the old CUS papers as well as many new titles — some original and some reprinted in pamphlet form from other sources. The collective discontinued its activities in 1971-72 with the decline of the student movement and the New Left.

In the Spring of 1972 the University of Toronto Students' Administrative Council purchased all the remaining Hogtown stock and continued the distribution service.

In the Fall of 1972, SAC turned over the operation to what immediately became an editorial and production collective calling itself New Hogtown Press. SAC provided this organization with operating funds; and although SAC retained ownership, at no time did it interfere with editorial decision-making.

The collective has expanded to its present membership of nine, greatly increased the number of titles, and broadened its readership. This progress has necessitated some changes. We have become too large an operation to continue to depend upon the Students' Council alone. Now that we are a non-profit corporation, we hope to be able to expand and develop, with a little help from our friends.

The titles listed in this catalogue indicate the scope of our interests. We hope to distribute an increasing amount of working class material and writing from the Canadian Left in general. Our aim is to promote a comprehensive selection of literature dealing with critical issues in Canadian society from a socialist perspective.

Approach libraries, bookstores and organizations in your area. Leave catalogues, tell them about us and encourage them to stock and distribute our material.


