After living together in Hawaii and California for two years, Alice and I were married in Hillsboro, Oregon on August 26th of 1977. It was the hottest day in this century for that city, 117 degrees Fahrenheit. Setting out on a journey of love and optimism that we would and could create a new social system, using marriage and our family as an "art form," we hardly noticed the heat at all.

Ours was a "politically correct" wedding. We wanted to take a public stand and outline our clear intentions to our community as responsible members. We wanted to go on record and have society bear witness to our desire to uphold our vows. We married to ritualize our agreement, a contract that confirmed our efforts at focusing our cocreation and clarity. Marriage for us was an opening, a definition of what we were available for, a true forsaking of all other options.

Being Liberals, we rejected the traditional, conservative social and religious ceremonies, and carefully wrote our own vows. We were married in a sparsely furnished house by our lovers at the time, and took no honeymoon because our life was charmed. After the brief and intensely moving ceremony, the four of us celebrated with a buffet of simple, elegant home made foods, and then went off to the movies to see Star Wars. The people who married us, although good friends and former lovers, were not a couple themselves. Even though we had all slept together and made love right next to each other just a week earlier, they did not want to get it on with each other, and were quite separate from each other.

This represented a problem for our budding marriage and social experiment because we were almost always at odds with them. He wanted to go off alone with either Alice or myself, rarely all of us together. Occasionally, he wanted to sleep with both of us while he kept other girlfriends who he didn't share with us. She tried to pull me off alone without Alice and really wanted to be monogamous.

Since neither one of them wanted to build anything resembling what we had in mind, we thought it best that we cut it off and go out on our own. I brought a social activist's perseverance to the marriage with my romantic visions of social reform as a means of achieving paradise on earth. Alice brought beauty, truth and a playful sense of sexual fun to our common goal for security and liberation.

We wanted to know, love, live with and maybe marry other couples like ourselves who were committed to each other and who also wanted the pleasure of sharing in creating a social transformation in the institution of the Family.

News Briefs

SOME ARE USING AN OLD TOOL for new purposes in California. A 60 year old state law allows two or more people to declare themselves officially as an unincorporated, non-profit association with the word "family" in the title. It costs \$10 and you get a colorful certificate, but it gives you no legal rights. It is a way to register your family's existence and may document your intentions to be considered a bona fide social unit. Some cities in California also allow for registration of domestic partners (Berkeley and Laguna Beach). These laws are being used

mainly by hetero couples who do not wish to get legally married and by gay couples who can not legally marry. Perhaps a bunch of registered group marriages would let the world know that marriage laws are religiously biased and out of date.

THE WONDERFUL FOLKS AT THE IRS have decreed that tax-free health coverage does not extend to nonspouse cohabitants. In other words those working for enlightened employers who give spousal health benefits to their unmarried partners will have the cost of those benefits included on their payroll stub as part of their gross income. (If they were married these benefits would be tax free.) On the other hand, a nonspousal partner may qualify as a dependent and thereby be entitled to tax-free coverage, but would have to meet all the IRS qualifications for a dependent and be approved for this status on a case by case basis by the IRS.

IN B.C. CANADA, FUNDAMENTALIST Mormon polygamy is making headlines with enforced marriages and sexual assaults. One man on trial had three wives and 22 children, another in the Kootenay colony had five wives and 45 children. Polygamy is punishable by up to five years in prison under the Criminal Code, but no one in Canada has been prosecuted for practicing Polygamy for religious reasons. A Canadian Advisory Council on the Status of Women has stated that Polygamy and slavery have many parallels and charges should be laid.

Polyfidelity hits network TV Small Minds in the Big City

It was, I suppose, everyone's dream come true. A last minute call from friends in California who told me that a national TV personality needed a group marriage for her show. Were we interested? You bet! Anything to get the word out. Plus the show would be shot on location in Orlando. Oh boy! Disneyworld here we come. I called and talked with the producer in NYC and he decided we would be ideal. Touchdown! We'd fly to Florida in a few days.

Another late night call. From the producer. Uh-oh. "Don't worry," he said. "The show's still on. Only it'll have to be in New York City, due to technical problems down under." Oh well, there went our visions of balmy skies in Fantasyland. New York, huh? In January? Eight million pushy people jammed together in a crumbling city of despair and greed. Oh well, I bolstered myself, at least it was home to sophisticated urbanites who revered social tolerance, intellectual vigor, and artistic freedom. Hah! I would soon find myself immersed in a genuine fantasyland, where my assumptions proved false, and my hopes for kindred human intelligence gave way to a bounty of ignorance.

Okay, so maybe I'm being a bit dramatic. We arrived at the studio of the Sally Jessy Raphael show at 11:45 am. Within an hour, the three of us would be sitting in front of a live studio audience, taping a show that would air about a week later on national television (Feb. 6). The theme of the show was "Torn Between Two Lovers." The idea was simple: two "couples" were present in situations where the woman was torn between her husband and boyfriend (in one case), and between two boyfriends (in the other). We were brought on as the sensational third choice of not having to choose between lovers at all. We were the group marriage option.

Far fetched? Sure. It's been our experience that people who back themselves into an emotional corner of tangled relationships are not prepared to consider group marriage. It usually takes deliberate thought based on rational choice and emotional maturity. So while we presented a logical sort of option to consider, really what these "torn" people needed was a methodology of therapy and decision making. Group marriage wasn't in the cards for them at this particular point. But so what; at least we were there bringing up an interesting idea for those level-headed adventure seekers who were ready to explore new relationship territory. Right? Wrong!

Maybe someone at home watching the show got something from the new ideas. But if the studio audience was

any barometer of thought and soul in America, we all better start praying. If audible gasps and groans were any indication, the audience was either suffering from massive indigestion, or they couldn't fathom what we were all about. Of course, I don't mind so much that others can't understand me, or don't think that what I'm doing is right for them. But since today's average person is exposed to more information in one day than someone in the Middle Ages was exposed to during an entire lifetime, I assumed, erringly, that such a person would be more astute and more understanding. In short, more sophisti-

Instead, what we experienced was a random and collective grouping of small minds guarding their turf of chauvinism and moral righteousness, governed by first chakra fears. The worst offenders were those who held up the Bible as their badge of authority and condemnation. How does one respond to this? Dialectic argument is futile. Instinctive anger is wasted. Compassion, though ultimately difficult, is the only loving solution. It is ironic that we often learn life's most difficult lessons from those people who utterly disregard those same teachings. Maybe their turn is coming. Or maybe they're just assholes. Who am I to judge? Not everyone was like this. The show's other guests and their friends were articulate and receptive, as were many of those on the production crew.

So, you ask, what are the great lessons here? OK, we covered compassion. Always a good idea. Remember, people are doing the best they can. The next lesson is that the level of fear and anger in other people is in direct proportion to the clarity and peace of mind that you possess. The last lesson is the most important. For all its size and incongruities, New York City is full of many warm and loving people, and the best Mexican food is in a little restaurant on West 44th Street between Broadway and 6th Avenue.

The Social Evolutionary Theory Behind Our Actions

Desmond Morris' book, *The Naked Ape* and the Frenchman Briffault's *The Mothers* go into great detail about how the roles of "Man, the Provider" and "Woman, the Nurturer" may have occurred naturally from technological and biological evolution.

According to them, anthropological research has discovered the period of human gestation (pregnancy) evolved in stages from three months to six months to nine months in order to accommodate the enlargement of the human brain. The female body also transformed in order to adapt to this change: wider pelvis area for carrying the infant and larger mammary glands to feed it. These changes slowed her down and made it harder for her to run or hunt and the period of her dependence on others was prolonged. From these biological changes came changes in the interpersonal relating, and a division of labor based on sex and strength took shape and formalized.

Men and women coming together for the sake of mutual survival is as ancient and primordial a reason as can be found. It all had to do with staying alive in a prehistoric world of superstition and unknowing. The idea of men and women coming together for love and compatible companionship is really recent: the end of the eighteenth century. And it isn't until the later part of the twentieth century that we find the female of the species able to re-enter the "hunt" with any sense of equality and independence.

Sociological premise #1: The Family is the basic unit of society, a microcosm of the larger macrocosm; #2: Institutions are extensions of interpersonal relationships; #3: Occurring in an historical context of fear, scarcity and competition, the underlying assumption of interpersonal relationships are those of dominance: submission; power: subordinate; master: slave.

The assumption of premise #3 is relatively new. It's only about 3,000 to 5,000 years old and it is simply that the man is an earthly agent of God (e.g. the divine right of kings and a man's house is his castle). A man's wife is answerable to him like he is answerable to God. God created Adam, then created woman from Adam's rib. In the ten commandments it states "Thou shalt not have any other God before me," and "Thou shall not covet thy neighbor's wife." The children are subordinate to both the man and the woman, although managed by the mother.

Another point from the top ten: "Thou shalt honor thy father and mother." Paternalism (I'm the boss because I'm older), Sexism (I'm the big shot because I'm a man), Racism (I'm white so I'm right), and Capitalism (I'm richer so I'm the master) in various combinations, deviations and reversals are direct social outgrowths of this simplistic assumption.

A historical context of scarcity and competition provided the prime organizing principles for the family, and society at large generally shared a "dog eat dog," "I win and you lose" perception of reality. With the domestication of animals, urbanization, culture, a general certainty of paternity, changes in inheritance laws, and the rise and sophistication of organized militarism came the solidi-fication and institutionalization of certain social roles, attitudes and structures.

We were young and in love and thought it was all so simple: change the form and people will be different.

Wrong.

It took us many years to realize that Function precedes Form!

Fifteen years and two children later, and we have been chasing those illusive other people who will bring us happiness and freedom to the point that we are exhausted and disillusioned. We have learned, the very hard way, a valuable lesson: that no one will or can make you happy or free and that we, ourselves, are the source of those feelings of happiness and freedom.

The mistake of putting Form in front of Function is the same mistake most people make anyway; looking at the picture of their goal, evaluating from that criterium, rather than perceiving reality and discovering what really works and what really doesn't work.

Form Chasing

We had plenty of hope and enthusiasm and no clear strategy for obtaining our goal. We thought we'd be spontaneous and adopted a king of "know as you go," trial and error approach to it. Lots of single men and women have wanted to sex with one or both of us, openly or covertly over the years. Other young couples we met were either not stable, struggling to arrive at a decision to marry or not, or just into dating until the right person came along.

Divorcees and serial monogamists were plentiful, failing marriages in desperation were plentiful. Polygamous scenes, one man with more than a couple women appeared occasionally, as did several triads of one woman and two men or one man and two women. There were married couples who were willing to do mate swapping and sport fucking, not to mention the vast number of possible married couples where either the wife was far out and the husband a turn-off, or the husband was a hunk and the wife was a dump.

In a few years it became obvious to us that our spontaneous approach was too accidental and muddled, so we put some plans together. The first thing we tried in our "Foursome fixation" was to make our own couples out of attractive or eager singles. The single people who were willing to fuck us and said they

wanted to create a family with us we put together with another single of the opposite sex. As soon as they would meet, they went trotting off into exclusive monogamy without us!

It was a shockingly similar result. The single guy or gal was hot to trot with us in a menage a trois, then when we put them together with someone else

for a foursome, the new couple went monogamous and exclusive, and we lost friends. Our thinking after this experiment was that the trick to finding what we wanted was in the numbers so to speak. The more couples we asked, the more likely we'd find those special people we were looking for.

In the early 1980's we were encouraged by Will Mahoney's "Beyond Monogamy" newsletter out of Colorado, and were disheartened when it stopped and Will went to work for a porno mag. We put ads in that newsletter looking for a couple or two to create a kind of group marriage. Neither Alice nor I liked this phrase, group marriage, however we couldn't find a better one at the time. We got some strange responses from the ad we placed. Besides lots of information for swing clubs and escort services, we got to meet liars, old folks who wanted live-in nurses, druggies, masochists, and herpes ridden psychotics. To say the least, we got gun shy from the ad scene.

In 1981, while in San Francisco, we visited Kerista commune. Their literature was sensible, intelligent and fun. However, the extent of their relating in a group was too radical a jump for us, we wanted to expand our "coupleness" not dissolve it. Ultimately, we realized that their radical approach might be correct,

however, it was just too much of an outgradient for our liberal tendencies.

By 1983 we both realized that the sociological form that we sought was actually preceded by our psychological functioning. We were not able to create what we wanted, so we had to learn

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how to do it. Like most people we learn best by imitating, so we decided to find some people who had what we wanted and were making it work, then study them. The only thing was that we couldn't find anyone who was doing what we wanted!

In the liberal circles of Boston-New York-Washington D.C. that we traveled in, there were a number of

couples who had discretely reached an "understanding" of sorts that allowed them to have extra-marital lovers. Still, politically, socially and emotionally this wasn't good enough for us.

So we decided that if there wasn't anyone in ready access to copy, then we would create a curriculum of learning for ourselves that would at least give us skills to get a better shot at what we wanted. In order to control and direct our minds and bodies more effectively, we studied a variety of disciplines from Yoga to wheatgrass therapy, and still we found ourselves alone.

In October of 1985 we moved were crazy. from Ulster County, New York to Portland, Oregon. ************* Alice opened a small shop on Bybee Blyd in Sellwood-Moreland called the "Willow Sap Studio" so she could pursue her desire to create art quilts and art banners, and I got accepted into a creative and substantial PhD program at Union Institute to pursue a doctorate in psychology. We had helped create a Waldorf school back in NY and were really pleased to find a good Steiner community and Waldorf School in Portland for our children.

We consider ourselves as part of a conscious social transformation, a spiritual evolution, a psychological revolution of which free and responsible sexual expression is a small, yet important part. It has occurred to us that this social transformation may take, say, 200 years!

It is 1991, and for 15 years, Alice and I have been persecuted and ridiculed for being nudist, freelove-anarchists, unreal idealists. Close friends have told us to "grow up, the 60's are over," "get our heads out of our crotches," and "be Yuppies, not hippies."

We have had such little support and encouragement for our goals for multiple relating, that our tendency at times to give up hope, feel victimized and complain has been great. There have been times we have gotten so caught up in the whirlwind of imploding circumstances that we actually forgot the reasons why we started out on this journey. In our confusion and frustration, we turned our anger first on ourselves, and then each other. There were a number of times we seriously consid-

ered divorce, thinking that individually we could make it without the other.

By the late 1980's, people didn't think of us as radical, they just thought we were crazy. We had our doubts too, so we sought outside professional feedback and help. We had one counselor tell us that our efforts to create an alternative structure was because we "hated our fathers and mothers for being working class, and that we held the opinion

that the working class sucks and we really wanted to be upper class." And, of course, since we don't believe in our own capacity to achieve wealth and success, we want to turn the whole social system upside down, still rebelling against mommy and daddy!

Another therapist told us that all "this political and social mumbo jumbo"

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is only a "justification" for our guilt ridden desires to have "sex slaves." We've even been disowned by relatives for being "possessed by the devil."

Fortunately, God has blessed us with both Love and a sense of humor. Our love and our children give us strength to go on and we laugh at the absurdity of our journey. We realize the importance of being happy with who you are and what you have now rather than to be sad about who you are not and what you do not have.

We started this journey for fun, happiness, more freedom, love and social transformation. Basically, that is still our point of view, and we feel great about it. Over the years we have spent an enormous amount of our life's energy, time and money in pursuit of our family goal and now times and things are different. I'm 43 and Alice is 36. We have two wonderful daughters 7 and 5 years old. Bills need to be paid; children need to be cared for; laundry needs to be washed; health, knowledge and art need attention. Life goes on and we finally agreed to put our polyfidelity efforts on a backburner and just wait for a wonderful situation to present itself and most importantly, to be ready when it comes.

Also, we realize the importance of tolerating impurity. Trying to be pure about "only relating to attractive married couples with children" is a way of setting ourselves up to fail. Asking other people to be pure is a way of setting them up. We had gotten a bit fanatical about couples, and like Einstein once said, "Fanatics are enthusiastic bores."

Finally, we agreed that it was time to communicate through the PEP vehicle and take advantage of its networking to create support and like-mindedness. In 1986 we first discovered PEP and have been supporting members ever since. We even attended the very first PEPCON for a day and met some very interesting and likable people. The PEP newsletter is the most sincere and pure effort we have seen in this country to present, educate and validate alternative relating and family structures.

In a primitive sense, when there were enough people with a vested interest in the maintenance and perpetuation of this status quo, they began to enforce their will and conditions on the rest of the tribe. The seeds of Social Darwinism were set in an historical context of fear and ignorance. "Only the strong survive!" "I must pass on the wealth I have accumulated to my son so that I can survive through him and we can grow stronger and stronger over time." The female body was viewed as a kind of pleasure factory to produce soldiers and field hands.

When the underlying assumptions of traditional interpersonal relations and the organizing principles of the traditional family unit are extended to their logical social conclusions, we have a competitive social system maintained by a hierarchical social structure of superiors, inferiors and competitors. For example, in religion: Pope, Cardinals, Priests. In the military: General, Captain, Private. In business: Chief Executive Officer, Manager, worker. In Education: Chancellor, Faculty, student. In Political entities: Nations, cities, your house. In Social Pyramid: Upper class, Middle class, Lower class.

The Theory: As people begin to transcend their roles and identify themselves as human beings, the underlying assumption of interpersonal relationships will move from one of power struggle to one of trust and knowing, and then social institutions, which are extensions of interpersonal relations, will begin to organize around principles of cooperation and surplus ("I win; you win; we all win!"). The Program: Monogamy, one man and one woman tied together for life, is the existing dominant, socially implanted, conditioned and reaffirmed form of marriage.

Most of what it means to be monogamous is not pure or functional monogamy, but rather dirty or dysfunctional monogamy. Generally, children inherit a patchwork quilt of borrowed beliefs, half-baked ideas and outmoded, useless prejudices as a definition of monogamy, and spend their lives trying to conform to an abstract picture of Father Knows Best: perfection that isn't even their own creation. Unable to make their natural urges work under these social conditions, the only alternative is "The Devil" or a criminal reaction: cheating, lying, breaking promises that could never be kept in the first place. Of course, "Fallen angels" need to be redeemed.

Liberal Beliefs: Work for change within the system. Working with your social conditioning is better than working against your social conditioning because most often you actually create what you resist. Swimming with the current is better than swimming against the current. Work with the historical form of marriage and shape it into a futuristic model, customized marriage, and you can have infinite variations.

Community Notes

Ganas Update

A group of six friends formed the Foundation for Feedback Learning in San Francisco in 1976. We moved to NYC together in the spring of 1979. Our combined resources were just about enough to buy and remodel a comfortable, old, 14 room house, located in a lower middle income, integrated neighborhood in Staten Island, one half hour ferry ride from downtown Manhattan.

By 1988 our numbers had grown sixfold. We acquired six more buildings and developed retail businesses in two of them. In retrospect it seems almost miraculous that five adjacent houses became available to us, one by one as we needed them, at prices we could afford at that time. We remodeled our seven buildings to suit the needs of our businesses and our lifestyle. They're all nicely furnished, attractively decorated and very well maintained. We expect soon to add a country community that will be housed in a 40 room hotel on 25 acres, about 100 miles north of the city. This property will be developed as a fitness and cultural center. Growth workshops will be added eventually.

In 1990 we changed our name to GANAS and our numbers grew to about 45-50. Some of us have been together for up to 25 years. Expansion will probably stop at about 55 people in any one location. Eventually we hope to spread by establishing other small communities as affiliated, self-governing cooperatives. The ages of GANAS members have ranged from 1-80. The majority at this time are between 30 and 50. Few children live here at the moment, but they have in the past and will again.

Many of us are either in monogamous or open couples. The rest engage in the whole range of social practices usual for single people. We are sometimes thought of as polyfidelitous, but probably don't qualify for the title. (Editor's note: They're right, they don't) We have no requirement for any kind of partnering behavior.

People of almost every race, nationality, religious or other belief system, and socioeconomic background have lived here, shared a lot, gotten along well together and enjoyed the experience. The differences are fascinating and enriching. Animosity is remarkably minimal.

We talk to each other all the time about whatever is happening, particularly when there is conflict to confront or plans to make. We try to hold back as little as we can of either fact or emotion. It is important to us to disclose fully and respond to everything disclosed. Closeness to each other has even higher value. Nobody who lives at Ganas is required or even necessarily expected to engage in any of the group's conversations or activities, except the core group. Everyone who lives here is invited to most meetings, and encouraged to make input to decisions. All opinions are welcome.

Ganas has only Three rules that are also its only requirements for residence in the community: 1) no violence to people, things, or privacy; 2) no exploitation (that is, everyone carries their own weight economically); and 3) no illegal activity.

We govern ourselves and our businesses with participatory management systems. Decisions are made by people in charge of specific areas of responsibility, after hearing all available input from everyone involved. Anyone can have an area of authority, if they want it and can handle it responsibly. Consensus or majority vote of the core group is used to arrive at decisions that affect the whole community.

There are three categories of membership available. Anyone can apply for them. 1) The core group consists of four men and five women who serve as the Board of Directors. They consider themselves a family, love each other deeply, and plan to spend the rest of their lives together. Each is committed to doing whatever needs to be done, whenever it is needed. All resources are pooled including talents, time, energy, etc. Those who work outside the community contribute their income, and help out at home when they can. If one leaves, they take out what they put in, plus what the group decides they've earned. Most overall decision making authority requires membership in the core group and full sharing of resources. The core group is open to, but not looking for, new members.

The second group consists of about 20-25 people who live and work in Ganas, but don't share their resources. They have varying degrees of involvement and sometimes form subgroups with their own philosophies and activities. Everyone in this group shares in the community's income to one extent or another. Each expects to earn more as the cooperative businesses prosper. We try to offer opportunities to learn skills and to enjoy the experience. Some in this group will eventually join the core group. Others will leave when their life directions change.

The third group consists of between 10-20 people who don't work with us. Instead, they contribute \$400-550 a month to cover all of their in-house expenses. They may work in the city, or they may be students, tourists, or retired people. They are here because they are interested in some form of feedback learning; or they are new to the US or the area and need help adjusting; or just because they enjoy living in community. They also have varying degrees of commitment. Probably a few will eventually join the core group as well. Any of them are eligible to work at Ganas if they want to and are qualified.

Economic support comes mainly from our two retail businesses and other income producing activities. Some

specific undertakings are supported by contributions. Our stores sell a variety of refinished and recycled items, as well as some new or consignment products. All of this happens in our two large, commercial buildings a few blocks from our residences. One houses our furniture store; the other markets everything else. Basic work arrangements are approximately the same for everyone, regardless of the job they do. Full time is about 30-35 hours a week, depending on the space selected. People can opt to work part time, on a very flexible basis. Full time people get \$200 a month plus in house expenses. In addition, everyone shares in the community's profit, but not equally. It is distributed according to complex criteria that involve commitment, contribution, productivity, etc. Occasionally unusual need or necessary skills are a consideration.

The core group has no fixed time or money arrangement. They take what they need, report what they used and what it was used for, and have agreed to spend as little on personal things as possible and to use all available resources for projects.

We hope to earn enough soon to provide everyone at Ganas with as much or more income than they could expect to earn in the general marketplace meantime, we all enjoy the equivalent of a middle class standard of living and an excellent quality of working experience. Our equipment and facilities include an excellent book, audio and video tape library; cable TV, VCRs; stereo systems; biofeedback equipment; computers, software, and copy machine; video and sound filming and editing equipment; a carpentry shop; an exercise room; and a small swimming pool set into a large deck.

Because we are situated on top of a hill, far back from the street, we have a view of the bay and unusual privacy for NYC. The land between the houses is large enough for many trees, some fruitbearing, berries, flowers, vegetable gardens, and fireplaces. We have several living rooms, six open porches in which to sit around and talk, party or just retreat. Also we have three laundry rooms, three dishwashers and 15 mod-

ern bathrooms. Personal spaces vary in size and include two small apartments.

Food is excellent and our meals are well balanced. We try to cater to everyone's preferences whenever possible. Most of us eat dinner together most of the time. Well stocked pantries, freezers and refrigerators in two of our three fully equipped kitchens are available at all times for people who prefer to do their own cooking, or who snack a lot.

Our major interest is better communication and new ways to improve learning skills. We work with areas as diverse as health education; relaxation, mind quieting and imagery language, particularly ESL; and self-determined behavior change. We are currently involved with creating animated and live videotaped instruction and a number of feedback approaches to extensive patient education and relaxation programs. Feedback learning methods use experiential or learn-by-doing approaches that offer on the spot performance information and recordkeeping for awareness of changes over time.

Projects in the larger local community relate to clean up, beautification, improved quality of life, and youth programs. Our networking activities include a proposal to help establish a central communities service office in NYC that would bring available information and resources to communities who need them everywhere.

Have Community Experience?

Many people who grow into polyfidelity have experience living in intentional and voluntary communities. Some, for example, have found that after living in community, they still desire something more intimate, and more family-like, so go on to build a polyfide group. Dear PEP,

I have some questions for Allan Jensen regarding his article on Spiritual Polyfidelity in the Jan 91 issue. Your mention of "rebirthing" breath exercises as a way of reaching or releasing subconscious pain rings a bell with me. I have done some rebirthing. Could you suggest any general breathing exercises? (And I am going to look for a rebirther.) I am also curious as to what sort of diet modification and fasting you find useful to help get you more in touch with your sensitive part. I have some "macho defenses" that need a push too. Thanks for writing What is Spiritual Polyfidelity.

I have been doing "dreambody work" also called "process-oriented psychology" developed by Arnold Mindell and others. His latest book Working on Yourself Alone: Inner Dreambody Work, Arcana Books 1990, seems to be the most useful to me. —Canada

I'm glad you enjoyed my article. As far as general breathing exercises, I find the basic rebirthing breath, connected inhale and exhale, is simple, easy to do, and works best for me. Early mornings are a good time to do some breathing due to increased body energy that's been stored up from the night's sleep. Also, a way to really clear emotional blocks is to use this breathing pattern right when you're in the middle of an upset. It helps you get in touch with the core issues behind your upset feelings; they're frequently different from what you think is making you crazy.

My diet is based on the Life Science teachings. Many people are familiar with these through the Diamond's books Fit for Life I & II. I eat mostly fruits, vegetables, nuts and seeds in their natural state (raw). I also fast (eat nothing, but drink distilled water for a period of time) to allow my body to cleanse. I've noticed that the more healthy my diet and body, the easier it is to access my true feelings instead of defensive justifications. I hope this info is helpful!

Dear PEP,

I enjoyed the humor of Jack L's letter (Jan '91) about attending PEPCON and his list of reasons for wanting polyfidelity. I'd like to share some comments here. First, I realize many who are interested in polyfidelity may not write down or get clear on their family desires, goals, and consenusal guidelines. Still, most people who are in families do have specific agreements. Just start talking about joining them or ask about any of the big areas of life (children, money, sex, decision-making) and you'll certainly get an earful. Singles have just as many must haves and must avoids in their lives. Getting these written down can feel too much like homework for some people (though as you mentioned it is a useful exercise!).

I also wanted to respond to the overall letter. It was a great job of reflecting on all the changes in daily life and in attitudes that adding another partner would require. The only way I can see someone making the leap is to uplevel. Successful polyfidelity, in my mind, means a total transformation of the self and relationship beliefs. Only this level of change has the potential power to sweep aside, replace and upgrade many of the concerns you mentioned in making the shift from having one to having more partners. Best of luck to you and -NEW YORK your family!

Dear PEP,

Regarding the PEPTALK article on open coupling in the Summer '90 issue, I doubt I'll ever reach the stage of polyfidelity. First of all I'm frustrated by not even getting to the point of fooling around on the side because it adds too much dishonesty to the relationship. Second, I haven't had a significant, open, inclusive or (preferably) communal relationship because the women I become intimate with tend to fall in love and want a one-to-one relationship, though I make it clear what I want from the beginning. I guess I'm just too perfect. I have long been interested in "poly-intimacy," but somehow haven't significantly reached such a state. I see several possible reasons for this. One is that I support some poly-intimate values too strongly, such as intentionality,

and honesty in the extreme, which some people don't feel comfortable with. Another is the difficulty of finding excuses to bring up the subject among "non-believers." And another is the ease of getting into a dyadic relationship and the difficulty of transforming it. At least in my present relationship, we can talk openly about it. Third, I doubt polyfidelity is what I want.

Your analysis of the primary-secondary triangle is good when talking about an isolated group, but we should be examining the possible structures of a neighborhood, or household network of lovers. As we increase the numbers in an intimate community, comparing our status in any one relationship loses its meaning (if it ever had any). This is particularly so in a group where people aren't limited to connecting with just one other person at a time, only of the opposite sex; in other words when we treat sex more as a form of communication, with the guidelines we use for good conversational and intellectual relationships. Can you explain why this should be possible for one kind of relationship and not the other? Sometimes it seems like I'm the only thinking person to whom it seems possible for both. I would like to "normalize" sex, to treat it much as we treat other kinds of relationships. To me this suggests an open, but with multiple intraconnections, intimate network. Your diagrams in the Primer all seem oriented toward groups, with no indication of infinite networks beyond. I don't see how polyfidelity, a closed group of people who attempt artificially equal involvments, can work toward the goal of "normal" sex.

I think I detect a contradiction between your "desire to legitimize differing forms of relating" and the seeming value judgment: "a polyfidelitous group...most cleanly represents the ideal family relationship for many people" (and especially for you). I agree more with "Canada's" view about the flag carrier. Different strokes for different blokes.

I like your comments on looking at any triad, couple, or whatever as not an isolated group, but rather a part of the larger whole. Most social configurations I've been in have included such a web of sexual connections and other types of friendships that it becomes quite complex. I choose in much of my writing to focus down to the "family" group. The diagrams in the Primer show the basic intimate relationship forms and don't go beyond (for lack of space and because it is not the theme of the book). I use the social unit of family because most folks can relate to the concept in some manner. In fact, it is fairly widespread among humans to feel a desire for belonging to a specific group which is their family. Beyond that, many long for a larger group sometimes called a Tribe. There simply are differences in the levels of relationship intensity between people. This is borne out through behaviors and attitudes. While many people would go all out for a family member, they are only willing to exchange energies on a lighter level for a neighbor or acquaintance. I see these differing levels as a decentralized system of human interaction and relationship rights and responsibilities.

Your desire for "normal" sex can be interpreted two ways. First, I agree it would be a calmer, saner universe if sex wasn't repressed and perverted by religions and social systems which fear its power. On the other hand, I think that sex is not an energy that is typically equivalent to a conversation. My belief system about it is best expressed through the Tantric vision. Sharing significant sex blends lives in a way that can rarely be casual or without significant emotional, spiritual, and pragmatic consequences.

I said in the article you mention that the ideal for many is polyfidelity and I stand by it. My comments come from my past 15 years of personal experience in polyfidelity and from talking to a very large number of folks about their relationship experiences. I have repeatedly found that people really do want stable, committed relationships, family if you will. Most affairs and secondary contacts are attempts at getting some sort of human contact rather than remaining isolated or celibate. People frequently get involved in these with the hope that the relationship will develop into something more in the future. Although for those with other priorities, these types of relationships may feel sufficient.

To repeat, what I am saying is that many people ideally would like a stable group of

loving best friends to live with. Upon achieving this type of home life, few people are drawn towards outside affairs. Rather they look for more people to include in their committed group (assuming the group is healthy instead of dysfunctional) up to some practical limit. Now obviously this isn't true for everyone or in every case. I love hearing success stories from folks who are living in all kinds of lifestyles. Any freely chosen and conscious form of relating is to be supported.

Finally, I don't find polyfidelity an "attempt at artifically equal involvements."
The point of polyfidelity is to allow each partner access to as great a level of intimacy as each other partner (equal rights and responsibilities in the relationship), and also to only come together with mutually compatible people. While this isn't an easy approach, it doesn't feel artificial to me either. Most people confuse the word equal with meaning "the same as." Obviously the relationships are not "the same," but they are of equal status. My partners are both equally important to me. Nothing could feel more normal in my love life.

Also as another family I know expresses it, by living this way you really learn how to love. This makes it easier to love each new partner when/if you come together. It's a wonderful and natural skill. —EDITOR


