Sex is powerful. When I tell people I am part of a group marriage, there are some common misconceptions that arise immediately. They assume an open door, a full bed, and a constant orgy. No matter what I say about the basics of love, commitment, and trust in my daily family life, they just smile. "Sure, sure," they say, "but who do you sleep with tonight?" Somehow my having more than one sexual partner, starts a movie in their mind titled "Erotica Unleashed."

The numbers issue is a real highlight. You see, the rule book says "there is a limit of one to a customer," unless of course you discard your present partner first (or semi-similtaneously). The religious and moral overtones of "you're doing something wrong or sinful" make the fruit of multiplicity look even more luscious and tempting. As we talk, the look in people's eyes either implies envy or self-righteousness at my "getting away with something."

Sex is a root chakra, survival energy, creative force. In every culture it is a magnetic symbol, described in songs, stories, and visual arts. Businesses use it to sell their products because it works consistently and relentlessly. Sex is the justification for merging lives in marriage and taking lives through revenge

Sex can relieve tension and be a healing energy experience. It can bind people together through deep and primal nonverbal and biochemical communication. Sex can bring about spiritual bliss. It is part of the essential core of selfhood for each person: a major part of their identity.

Unfortunately, as John Bradshaw states in his book, Healing the Shame that Bindss, "...perhaps no aspect of human activity has been as dysfunctionally shamed as much as our sexuality." I believe that this shaming is the source of the sleazy assumptions many people make about non-monogamy. And, for a small, misguided subset of people pursuing nonmonogamous relationships, this shame may be the root of their motivation in the lifestyle.

Being Hooked

Addiction is a word so widely used it can lose its meaning. Here, it's used to describe "a pathological relationship to any mood altering experience that has life damaging consequences." (John Bradshaw) So, while sex plays a big role in almost every human's life, it

only becomes an addiction when that person's actions are compulsive and destructive.

Multiple sexual affairs, anonymous sexual contacts, and endless chains of serially monogamous partnering, can all be symptoms of sexual addiction. I've met people who compulsively have sex with almost anyone available, no matter the real personal attraction or future consequences. I've encountered many men who push for their female partner to have sex with another woman in their presence. Unfortunately it also frequently seemed quite clear that the woman involved wasn't personally bisexual, or running out her own fantasy, but rather codependently performing to keep her male partner satisfied. I've seen people whose never ending affairs have negative impact on their work lives, and others who in a time of AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases simply don't admit that their relentless one night stands might

Census Stuff

The 1990 Census, for what it's worth. reports fewer married couples heading households and households of smaller size than the last census in 1980. While 30% of households were "nonfamily," in which no two individuals are related by blood, marriage, or adoption, these were in most cases just one person households. Some were reported to be groups who did not have "traditional" family ties. More specifically, the US average for households of groups of unrelated adults is 4.6%, with Nevada having a high of 8% and New York with over 5%. The average people per household decreased from 2.75 in 1980 to 2.63 in 1990. How low can it go?

Strange Bedfellows

Mormon polygamists are starting to go public with their lifestyle. Since other groups with non-traditional lifestyles have gained some ground in legitimacy and tolerance, polygamists are also seeking a more open life. In places like Colorado City Arizona, polygamy has remained a way of life even though a century back the Mainstream Mormon church sold out its practice of plural marriage to gain statehood for Utah. Since the police are no longer actively prosecuting polygamists, more families have come out of the closet.

The American Civil Liberties Union is considering making legal recognition of polygamy part of its cause. The Utah State Supreme Court found that practicing polygamy in and of itself did not make a family ineligible for adoption. Estimates are that up to 50,000 people in the Rocky Mountain states live in fundamentalist Mormon polygamous families (one man with multiple wives and children). The men usually marry only the first wife legally, then cohabit with each of the following ones. This keeps

them from being charged with bigamy, and most states rarely prosecute for cohabitation and adultery, although the laws against these are still on the books in some places.

Despite some negative reports of cultlike practices of forcing young women into polygamous marriages, other women in the lifestyle report benefits such as more home support in having a career and raising children. "The women help each other." Many women have college degrees and professional careers. In areas where this lifestyle is common, the children report no problems with getting hassled at school. One family has an 11 bedroom house with a dining table big enough for the adults and their 19 kids. Another man in town has 80 children! (Did these folks fill out their census forms???)

Getting Out the Word

The July-August issue of Yoga Journal includes responses from myself and Deborah Anapol of Intinet in it's Letters to the Editor. We both stressed the fact that working on spiritual goals is just as possible in group marriages as monogamous couples. Consider doing this yourself. If you read an article about relationships that leaves out the multiple option, write in and express it yourself. Reach out to those who may not realize that they have a real relationship choice beyond monogamy!

SURVEY STORIES

Thanks to all of you who responded to PEP's 91 survey so far. Since this year's questions were designed to help you tell your story, the returns have included many interesting experiences and comments. Some of them are reprinted here.

I DISCOVERED* I WAS NONMONOGAMOUS WHEN...

I felt myself deeply loving two people at once and found that it felt so intensely involving and rewarding...I read Stranger in A Strange Land by Heinlein, at age 17...I read Stranger in A Strange Land at 15...I read The Harrad Experiment ... Descriptions of domestic arrangements in Heinlein's SF novels lead me to consider group marriage as preferable at an early age...I realized over and over, til it "took," that I am bisexual... I noticed that I was living with two women...I'd been happily monogamous for several years, but then met another person who I wanted to bring home and live with too. I didn't have a clue about how it could work, but I just felt that love was more important than social conventions and rigid thinking. Despite my anxiety, I started to bring up the idea. The results were escapades that B grade movies are full of. Laughter, tears, defenses, great insights, and rapid growth. It took real commitment to move through all the emotions each person encountered and still keep talking and stay friends. The magnitude of results in my life encouraged me to always believe in the power of love and keep a firm hold on it...I realized that I was in love with more than one person and that it was okay ... I was working and living in a house with equal numbers of men and women, many trying to couple-up in a semi-competitive manner. That's when it hit me, why not just share our relationships as we do with material things and household chores?...I never thought of being monogamous... My first wife and I had a wonderful weekend with another couple, back in 1964, sharing everything. Ever since that weekend (sailing to Catalina), I've been trying to perpetuate that ambience...I was about 20 and my wife was 24...I felt that I could love more than one person without short-changing either one...The discovery came when I had sex with more than one partner. But I've known for at least a decade that I could

share intimate love with more than one other person, even before I put it into practice. (*most people indicated it was a discovery not a decision)

MY MAIN REASONS FOR BEING NONMONOGAMOUS ARE:

I can't see any good reason not to...Having a one person limit is stifling ... Excitement!! ... I'm bisexual and don't want to choose female or male...A personal vision of a new way of life...I don't like jealousy or possessiveness and don't desire to limit my own or other's intimacy... I want a family life including more than just one other adult ... Sexual and intellectual variety... More security and continuity of relationships with an enhanced sense of community...The practical reason is I have two partners...I want a family of more than two adults...There's more support and love available...Intensity, variety, and love...I love more than one person at a time...Inability to be monogamous... It's more fun in general...Fun, stimulation, and growth...It's fun and interesting to get to know people well, and having sex with more than one is also sometimes fun and interesting...Joy...I learn and grow more from relating on a deep emotionally intimate level with more than one person, and it feels natural frequently to have sexual relationships with those to whom I relate

WHAT I WANT TO SHARE MOST ABOUT MY EXPERIENCE IN THE LIFESTYLE IS...

I feel much happier and more satisfied as a non-monogamous person. No more serial monogamy! I'm a female with a "husband," and I'm looking for a "wife," and it's okay!...The fact that it could be a viable option for millions of people, if the word got out and some loosely structured framework were available for learning and socializing... It's all really about personal and spiritual growth...It is possible and practical to have a group marriage, even though it's not easy. A polyfidelitous family is a great way to heal dysfunctional biological family issues, redoing the context, but this time no secrets, power trips, or abuse. Just more love and acceptance...It's not all strawberries and cream. It's a great way to live, but there are lots of difficult times and pitfalls and it's a LOT of work, with great payoffs. Those who are considering it should know about both sides of the story, not just the fantasies...For me, it's hard, and what's hardest of all is

that I have to live with the situation, whatever it is, day to day. I can't necessarily decide it's going to be some way and stop looking at the way it really is. It takes a lot of attention and willingness to stay in the present. It keeps me honest. And it teaches me about myself and relationships as though it were a post graduate crash-course study program. Oh, and it's fun... I've spent most of my time meeting other people who share this common interest, but whose differences in other areas, including reasons for being in this lifestyle, preclude making as many meaningful connections with others as singles are capable of effecting... I was initially attracted to the lifestyle partially for the wrong reasons. I honestly did have a fear of commitment because I had grown up in a family where love meant possessiveness, smothering and having someone trying to run your life and live their life through you. I didn't really realize, at least on an emotional level, that you could love without all those things, so my reaction was not to get too committed to (read stuck with, trapped by, entangled with) one person. One day I realized there was a problem in how I was approaching relationships. I went to see a very good therapist for a while. I was terrified I would be turned into a monogamist (sort of like being turned into a frog). But good therapy helps you become more who you truly are, so I guess if I'd turned into a monogamist that would have been OK, since that meant it was my natural inclination. But I didn't. I emerged a stronger, more whole, more healed, more self-assured person. I knew who I was, and I knew I could get close to someone without losing myself. I found I very much wanted real intimacy, emotional sharing, warmth, nurturance, honesty, and I still thought it would be great to have it with more than one person. My fear of long term commitment had disappeared, and it became much easier to tell who was really right for me and who would lead to a "disaster." Now my two relationships are thriving, and give me great joy...We would like to see all people who are interested in this kind of lifestyle able to communicate with each other without fear or prejudice... Be patient. If it's hard to find one partner be ready to wait in time2 X effort2 the number of people to be included...It's how I stay awake and remember to share cake.

Jealousy, Trust, and Agreements in Group Marriage

Jealousy stabs the heart of most adults in couples and group marriages, faithful or not. The doubt in love arises when one sees or hears a lover or partner touching or even talking to another person, in the family or out. Why? Is jealousy natural or what?

Fear of jealousy seems more common than jealousy itself. Both keep couples attached and closed to outside affection and sex. They both prevent most adults from even considering group marriage. Is jealousy human nature or an antisexual cultural program to make and keep monogamous families under control by law, peer pressure, family ties, and fears of rejection.

I was in two group marriages in Oregon: the first in the mid 70's and the second in the mid 80's. Both revolved around natural healing, honesty, cooperation, and parenting. We had one child, and at the end two boys in Eugene who we coparented. Jealousy, the fear of not enough love, came up occasionally when we were afraid our lover was loving another and rejecting us. We were usually open about showing affection to anyone and it was easy for insecure souls to feel rejected, left out, and unloved. When I felt jealous or "needy" as we called it, it was a signal to do some self healing work: to release the fear reaction of separation from love, to love myself even if others were rejecting me.

Whenever I feel left out, needy or jealousy, I stop, sit or lay down, and breathe deeply, continuously and consciously until the feeling passes, and I've released the fear or need and can be open again. Healing my jealousy by deep breathing, crying, talking, and primal screaming (a rebirthing process) dozens of times has helped me to love myself, and to forgive and openly love my partners now.

My jealousy reminded me of my Mom and Dad dancing, hugging or kissing, which I hated. It excluded me and I felt rejected by their affection. It triggered me to feel needy for it, which I denied like most "good" boys and girls. I wanted Mom's exclusive love, all of her, never got it and hated reminders of the lack. Could this family rejection reaction be the source of most of our jealousy of lovers? Of our feelings of being ignored or not loved enough?

My jealousy lets me stay in bed rebirthing until I'm clear again. It transforms my attitude from needy fear to honest love. But owning that I cause my jealousy and need to release it totally is hard if I deny the deep emotional charge and past causes. Now I don't feel jealous because I don't expect more than what is coming here and now, and I love myself enough to fill the need I ask for.

Jealousy, when we fear or hate our lover going to bed (sex?) with another, can stem from being rejected from our parent's bed. The family-bed of open intimacy is natural in India and traditionally many tribal families slept together, playing there. I wasn't let into my parent's bed except a minute or so for fun, or if I was sick and my Dad was gone. Bed was a secret (or shameful?) place of adult mystery. So I confused sex (unseen) with the love that was totally missing in my childhood, except while in Nature.

Jealousy is expected, like the "hurt" of seeing parents sexing in bed or wherever. Both are illusions of co-dependent family and are based on attachment and the fear of rejection, banishment, and punishment. The trust we need to work through years of such fear and denial is a self healing work I call "reparenting our inner child of love." This work needs to be part of any deep family or group marriage now.

Jealousy seems "natural" to humans who are attached to partners, kids or friends in this private property and possessive culture, clinging to signs of love. Couples expect it and some mates will test their lover by causing jealousy as a way to find out if "they care" or "want me." This is a co-dependent tactic to measure one's clinging, not bonding in real love. Proving that you love me by feeling jealous of my connection with others shows a manipulation to get a phony proof of love.

Most emotions are so deep in guts and origin, and are so repressed by most adults that reaching real agreements is rare because discussing these feelings is so mysterious. I've found in twenty years of family counseling that most couples and parents don't have agreements about emotions and how to heal or simply allow them. To many it seems safer to deny and forget. But that causes other conflicts and blocks to growing closer and more loving. Blocking bad feelings also blocks pleasure, ecstasy, and bliss: the natural results of relaxing, meditating, and loving. Jealousy, like envy, is a superficial emotion hiding the loss of love we had long before and our fear of rejection of our current needs. I find that real trusting agreements about emotional work is a miracle that supports healing of resistance by opening and letting go to learn what is real right now. Most conflicts and power struggles are really a lack of trust and agreements needed to cooperate in relating. But in our competitive culture, cooperating is rare and radical if deep.

Honesty about jealousy is better than stuffing it to be nice. But to solve it, we must go under, behind and before the reaction to learn its cause and to prevent it from spoiling our relationship. Honesty reveals hurt, pain, fear, sadness, hate, lust, needs, and anything, even ESP, which most people resist with manners, consideration or independence. So to sit face-to-face to share our deepest self is necessary and often scary. What will come up?

We even test agreements and trust by failing to keep them. Then we need to admit this to change or to recommit. This takes a commitment to loving it all, good and bad. Jealousy is a challenge, a doubt in being loved and lovable in the way we expect it sexually or totally. If we don't share ourself openly and

deeply, it is common to project that or lack. Then we hold back our love or things we need to express to really get or let go of, like childhood hurts. No one can fix our jealousy by a promise to "not feel that way again." It is deeper than that and will return if repressed by being "sorry" for feeling jealous or causing it.

The rage or anger of jealousy is like a tantrum of a child wanting to get their way. Their "being hurt" is a disappointment of an expectation to be loved more than it is now. "How could you do this (hurt) to me?!?" is a helpless victim or blaming or self-pitying stance. Both the introverted hurt and sadness and the extroverted anger and rage of jealousy are a scarcity of love. Not trusting there is enough affection to go around to fill needs. Jealousy victims even strive to make the "offender" feel guilty for loving others.

Natural coupling takes trusting that my and my partner's agreements are keeping us together or that we'll negotiate new agreements on space. It takes me dozens to hundreds of agreements depending on how much work and play, open and deep we are together sharing our creative energy. So verbal contracts or trusting agreements are the core of any bonding. But counselors are often needed to just allow free expression. Agreements to share all emotions are essential to continue growing in love at home.

Welcome to the Nest

When I first met Family Tree it was like going on a blind date with thirty people. My first contact was by phone. I had never met anyone in the group. At the next event, a museum trip, I showed up in the lobby of the Museum of Science and waited. My fears that I wouldn't recognize the group were groundless, they were the ones who were all busy hugging each other. I watched the way these people greeted each other and knew at once that I wanted to be part of that group. To join officially one must be sponsored by several other members, which means

showing up to enough events that people get to know you. I became a regular player at the D & D evenings. I laughed; I made new friends; I slowly grew closer to some in the group.

There was a wonderful warm feeling of acceptance and general fondness, but still no romance. The "dungeon master" and I began flirting mildly, then some months later he gave me a ride home after the game. Well, one thing led to another, and it was wonderful! When we tried to arrange another date, the next time we both were free was a month and a half away, so the courtship took a while to get off the ground. Things have steadily deepened between us since then, and it has been one of the best relationships of my life.

Is there a catch? Well, this is the world of alternative lifestyles and plural relationships. He's married, firmly and committedly for the past twenty years. And he has two other lovers he's committed to maintaining his relationship with. (And those lovers have spouses or lovers, and so forth.) Basically, he is part of an intimate network, a family, of about half a dozen people. A great deal of his time is spoken for. Many people, including those of us involved, are mystified as to how he manages to keep so many relationships going, but it does work. The biggest logistical problem has been time. The biggest emotional problem has been jealousy.

The other three women are all good people with whom I have quite a bit in common (besides him, I mean). We got to know each other socially before romance hit and stirred things up. And we had the best possible situation. Here is a group of people who are all explicitly committed to the idea of plural relationships and have been dealing with the issues between themselves for some years already.

And yet philosophy isn't real life. When romance bloomed for me, all three of the other women felt uneasy and struggled with jealousy. Every one of them worried about losing some of their own time with him, or maybe being "bumped" entirely. There is also a phenomenon described as the "last sweetie" theory. This is the (usually un-

conscious) assumption by the most recent person that she was what the beloved was looking for all along, and now that he's found her, there will be no more new relationships.

If there is a new relationship farther down the line, then (according to this theory) she wasn't what the other person was looking for after all, and great uneasiness follows. Also wailing, sulking, tears and gnashing of teeth, depending on the temperament of the people involved. In times of change all our unconscious assumptions rise to the surface, and make a mess of what our rational self has arranged so neatly.

Even proceeding with all the tact I could muster, there was no way I could make all these other women feel at ease with me or about the situation. Even in the best of all circumstances, people have fears and turbulent emotions and jealousy. In the long run the best cure was getting to know each other better. Working on closer friendships, even though it felt like an uphill course sometimes, helped lessen the fears. I think the biggest difference between monogamists and pluralists is not whether or not there is jealousy, but what the stated ideal is and what constitutes acceptable behavior. The stated goal in this case was harmony and acceptance. Politeness towards each other was expected even in the middle of confused emotions. So we work to approach that, and gradually draw nearer. In the ordinary world, the confused, undefined state in the middle is pushed by prevailing norms towards separation and hostility.

For me, the richness of all these interwoven relationships is so special I don't have the right words to describe it. I have the new, one-to-one love, but I also have all these other friendships or, more properly, kinship relationships that I would never have gained otherwise. I enjoy the time alone with my lover, but I also enjoy "family time" when the larger group is together. One evening in the middle of the usual zoo, people all around us, running in and out, talking, eating, hugging, he put his arms around me and said, "Welcome to the nest." It feels good; it feels like love. It feels like being home.

be risky to their health and that of their loved ones.

Some people keep their sexual addiction hidden. They simply live double lives. They control and confine their addictive behaviors, bingeing only with certain people, in specific parts of their city, or in the privacy of their home. Other types flaunt their sexual obsession, at least among some circles, presenting themselves as truly liberated and free of hang-ups. Their sexual addiction may be difficult to recognize. Culturally, being a playboy type is frequently seen as a positive attribute, admired by those who aren't jealous of it. Scoring is applauded and seen as a victory of sorts. Body count is the goal and quantity is superficially more easy to demonstrate than the quality and intimacy in relationships.

In sex addiction, there is a clearly unhealthy element to the behaviors. The person feels out of control or looks out of control to those close to him/her. Love affairs end disastrously with the person moving immediately on to new pointless liaisons as a sort of quick "fix." Filling in the gap with another relationship (or several) is compulsively seen as the goal. An addicted person takes unintelligent risks in areas such as birth control, disease prevention, and simple personal safety. S/he ends up dealing with unwanted pregnancies, abortions, diseases, and other injuries. For some it can go to the extreme of masturbating to the point of self-injury, or hanging out in high risk areas and ending up in brawls or getting raped.

Since sexual contacts are the major focus, the person may not attend to significant commitments at work or home, instead taking off long lunches from the office or not returning home until 4 a.m. Work, school, family and friends are all given second rate attention. The addict may feel alternately drawn to and repelled by their sexual activities, and see themselves as unique, and their needs different from others. And they may actually experience acute physical symptoms, withdrawal, when they stop having sex.

Chemistry

Sexual addiction has a purely physiological element. Milkman and Sunderwirth in their book Craving for Ecstasy: The Consciousness and Chemistry of Escape, describe how orgasm is a function of the brain more so than the genitals. The ecstasy of sexual activity and orgasm involves endorphins which are known to produce euphoric effects. In The Chemistry of Love, Michael Liebowitz notes that the peptide PEA has a molecular structure similar to amphetamines. This peptide is involved in romantic attraction and early courtship, inducing highly aroused states. People in recovery from sexual addiction report sex as an extremely difficult "drug" to withdraw from.

Sexual addiction can be identified most clearly by its patterns and results. Frequently those addicted use sex obsessively to control and defuse the pain in their lives. The relationships involved are exploitative, with the other person seen and used as an object towards this desired end. Even over time their relationships do not increase in intimacy or emotional warmth. They are instead patterned "fixes" which are compulsively repeated to soothe and diffuse the emotional pain of the addict.

The culture as a whole encourages addiction, as evidenced by the enormous numbers and types of behaviors which are engaged in compulsively. Patrick J Carnes, in his book Don't Call It Love: Recovery from Sexual Addiction, lists elements which "allow addiction to thrive." These include an orientation towards "convenience and easy solutions in satisfying needs; sophisticated technology that will solve any problem miraculously; entertainment and escapism instead of value and meaning in life; constant change which makes it difficult to choose and hold onto important values; disrupted family life where divorce, both spouses working, and latch key children make abandonment a key issue in everyone's life; loss of community and social isolation; a high stress culture where everyone is chronically overextended or simply struggling to survive; a general denial of reasonable limits and recognition of reality; and a multiply addicted society which

passes on these addiction to its children and where addiction is seen as the norm."

Coaddiction is when an addict's partner participates in the addictive process. To stay in the unhealthy relationship with an addict, a partner usually allows their own self esteem to be devastated. They participate in acts they are not comfortable with, allow treatment which they do not deserve, and make the addict's behaviors the focus of their own life. Obsessing on the actions of the addict takes them away from their own life and problems. They become used to the emotional ups and downs, juiced by the excitement of the constant crises in their lives. They may refuse sex to try to control the addict or go track him/ her down at a lover's apartment and create a scene. They may cover up the addict's time away from work or home; become more sexually active to try to keep pace with their partner; threaten to end the relationship, but never follow through; take on personal responsibility for the addict's problem ("if only I were nicer, more attractive, sexier ... "); or simply become self-righteous and blame the addict, sometimes even having homicidal thoughts. Sexually, they may shut down or have a revenge affair(s) of their own.

Affairs

"I believe that no interpersonal or pseudorelationship addiction has anything to do with love. These addictions may have something to do with the illusion of love, and they have nothing to do with true loving and, in fact, are ways of avoiding love and intimacy." Abbe Wilson Schaef in Escape from Intimacy

The word affair implies an illicit, dishonest liaison: cheating, lying, or hiding the truth. People who are monogamous have affairs when they are bored, or going through transitional periods in their lives. A new child, a missed promotion, or a preoccupied spouse can all generate stresses and produce a person who is ready to and needs to "fall in love" again. Affairs are used to build up self esteem: "See I'm still attractive, desired, able to get laid."

Cheaters say they believe that by not

telling their partner about their affairs they are protecting them, keeping them from being hurt, but are really protecting themselves. They are afraid of the truth, afraid to face the results of their actions. They are looking for an escape from the lives they've created and use ship. This person may have great fears, and resentments, but s/he will say "I'm open too." This is obviously just postponing a confrontation with reality. It also sabotages any relationships entered based on the misconception that everyone agrees about nonmonogamy.

been hidden. Bringing "secrets" out into the light is quite freeing and can create much deeper intimate bonding between people.

Recovery and Healthy Relating "People tend to think sex addiction is about

"People tend to think sex adalction is about sex; it is not. It is about core feelings of loneliness and unworthiness. Many addicts, in fact, encounter their sexuality for the first time as part of recovery when they experience sex without shame." Patrick J Carnes in Don't Call It Love

Sex addiction is just beginning to be recognized in this society in other than its most extreme forms. Just as people now recognize that alcoholism doesn't only include falling down drunks, problems with intimacy and sexual relationships that used to be overlooked are now being recognized. People who are not addicts can still learn about and change some of their own unhealthy patterns from the experiences of those with more dominating problems.

Those involved in multiple relationships have plenty of experience to reflect upon. Any interpersonal weakness that arises within a one-to-one relationship will be magnified in a more complex form of relating. Many people who thought they were getting involved in non-monogamy simply for more sex and intimate variety have discovered that lust just isn't enough. Healthy non-monogamy requires increased personal responsibility and adherence to high standards of personal and interpersonal truth. It also implies a desire to grow through the insights and changes that arise in the relationships. Flexibility and a strong love of learning are absolute musts for lastingpower in love.

People with extremely damaging sex addictions have recovered. Removing the shame based and compulsive attachments to sexual and relationship patterns is not easy, but is composed of fairly simple steps. First, many addicts choose a period of celibacy or absolute fidelity as a sexual "fast" to improve their interpersonal health. Instead of acting on their obsession, they simply face it and grow in their honest awareness of themselves. Learning to

the new sex as a way to fill the emptiness they feel. Unfortunately, the intensity of experience doesn't equal intimacy.

Most people look at nonmonogamous lifestyles from this perspective of affairs. Relationships beyond one partner are seen as affairs with all these negative trappings, although it takes only a little discernment to distinguish between affairs and consciously choosing to have multiple relationships.

Affairs and addiction actually exist in stark contrast to conscious forms of nonmonogamy. The most important difference is personal choice and honesty. While affairs just "happen," true nonmonogamy is clearly and consciously chosen. A person who identifies as nonmonogamous can directly and comfortably verbalize her/his choice. This means that, for example with a couple, both parties can and do (in context, of course) express their agreement to be open. It also means that each person is freely and individually choosing the multiplicity.

Oftentimes one person in a couple will "go along with" their partner's desire to be open simply to stay in the relation-

Honesty in communicating about multiplicity is essential in distinguishing it from illicit affairs. All parties involved, each and every lover, must know the real score. Crucial information includes the primacy or secondariness of different relationships, who's having sex with whom (to stay away from secrets and also for disease control), and ongoing updates on how everyone involved is feeling about the inter-relationships. Without this information flow, lovers will make assumptions and act on them instead of reality. Deciding and choosing in a vacuum, without relevant data. means that it's easier for blame, shame and bad feelings to arise.

In every relationship, trust develops and is maintained by having basic agreements which are mutually satisfying and keeping these agreements. In multiple relating, where the complexity of relationships is increased, a sound base of trust is particularly necessary.

The lying and deception involved in affairs demolishes the trust between lovers. An honest multiple relationship can be the most trustworthy precisely because it includes directness and honesty about areas that have for so long

release feelings of shame and to grow in self-love and acceptance are prerequisites to loving others fully. Attending to current feelings and sensations and taking on a more process oriented rather than goal oriented style brings them into the present and out of preoccupation. Honesty and sharing instead of holding back and vagueness increase opportunities for real intimacy. And finally, the main work is in developing a clear sense of self, so that sex, when, where and with whom, becomes a lov-

ing choice rather than something that simply "happens" again and again.

For many people, healing their addictions is most easily accomplished by using a set program (like 12 step groups) and finding a new social network that embraces the values they want in their life. This new group provides friendship and support and a place to practice healthy interpersonal skills and to grow together in intimacy.

Healing at Home

With the vast numbers of individuals who have come from dysfunctional families (who hasn't?), no one can escape the need for healing. Injuries from childhood may be covered over with perpetually "happy childhood" stories, simply blanked out, or passed over with "Oh, it wasn't so bad. I lived, didn't 1?"

While not everyone is a total addict, many people play along the edges. Not completely out of control, but every once in awhile or during a stressful period, their drinking, eating, or sexual preoccupation takes the driver's seat. Usually it's just a temporary binge, but even then the damages can be severe or the behaviors can feel confusing. "Why did I eat that, drink so much, sleep with him/her?"

The experience of addicts is graphically descriptive, and gives great insights to those willing to look. Everyone has something to gain in identifying and releasing unhealthy patterns in their life. People who embrace nonmonogamy can examine the healthy and perhaps unhealthy motivations that this choice is based on for them. Some may find that they seek multiple relations to avoid real intimacy, trying to "hide out in the crowd," some may see that their constant "on the make" behavior says more about their own emptiness than about their true intimacy appetite, and others may realize that they are actually monogamous, but have been trying to act open to stay in pace with a partner who they do not want to lose. Identifying the patterns is the first step in healing. The most important questions are always, "Are my sexual choices working in my life? Are they rewarding to me? Or am I just acting out old patterns that ultimately feel unsatisfying?"

Resources For Making a Change

These organizations vary in style and values. Some hold men's groups and women's groups separately, others hold mixed meetings. Meeting places may be confidential or openly advertised. Requirements for membership usually include a "desire to stop compulsive sexual behavior." The definition of sobriety in the various groups ranges from "no sex unless married" (Sexaholics Anonymous) to bottom lines of "committed, intimate, nurturing, unashamed sex with no victimizing, secrets, or anonymous contacts." Co-addicts are welcome at some meetings for addicts; they are considered equals. In other groups, co-addicts are not able to participate and must join other organizations specifically designed for them. All these groups respond promptly to inquiries and have great resources to share. Check them out if you or a loved one needs some support.

Getting the Word Out

Aloha, Thanks for your suggestions.
Reaching out to new people and promoting polyfidelity in general is a major part of PEP's purpose. We run ads in many national magazines, including Mother Jones, Yoga Journal, New Age, Tantra...we try what we can afford. In addition, we focus on networking with other organizations and

publications, sharing through press releases, articles, and letters to the editor. Person to person communication is particularly powerful, so we meet and talk to people involved in all kinds of groups in a constant exchange of energies to get the word out.

PEP is always open to members helping us with our advertising. You can send us names and addresses of publications you think would be good places to run our ads; you can sponsor a particular ad in your local paper (either through our office or through your local group); you can contribute money to PEP specifically for a certain ad's placement or for more advertising in general. We all appreciate and benefit from this kind of input and sharing of energy.

If you have a local group going, PEP can help you with suggestions and support as well as ads, flyers, and our info packets. We can also supply bulk orders of our publications at reduced costs to groups working to distribute information about polyfidelity or running discussion groups. Loving More Journal will put in an announcement for your local group and also list you in our resource section.

We send information about polyfidelity to groups involved with relationship services, counseling, or research in the hopes of increasing their awareness about our lifestyle. Our intent in giving materials to these organizations is to teach the teachers so the information will spread geometrically!

PEP has donated a number of copies of our books to libraries (as well as to other groups). In addition, last year a patron's grant allowed us to send the Polyfidelity Primer to many libraries in the Bay Area of California, as well as in Hawaii. If you'd like to donate a copy to your local, simply send in your order along with your library's address and we'll keep the information flowing together.

Christian Tolerance

Dear PEP, Let me congratulate PEP on the new look of *Loving More*, the new membership structure, and including the *Network* in each issue. I am renewing, but one thing bothers me about the articles, the letters, and the ads. They seem anti-religious, especially against Christians. I would hazard a guess that fundamental Christian polygamists out-

number Mormon polygamists and that together they far outnumber all the other polyfidelitous marriages in the USA and Canada combined. Yet in almost every issue there is at least one article putting down Christianity in one form or another. And the only religions mentioned in the *Network* section are Wiccan, New Age, Neo-Pagan, and metaphysics. As a Christian, a minister who is willing to perform "bondings," and someone who hopes and prays to add to my own family, I find this disturbing. —WASHINGTON

Alohal I'm glad you like the changes we've made with the newsletter this year, and thank you for your renewal which helps us pay for our publishing and outreach. I'm sorry you feel disturbed. As editor, it is my judgment that determines what is printed or not printed in PEP's publications. As a frequent author, I definitely state my views as clearly as possible. As a member of a polyfidelitous family who is very public about our lifestyle, I have encountered aggressive, negative responses only from Christians. Other groups or individuals who disagree with my family choice, simply leave us alone.

In live audiences, on radio phone-ins, or in print, fundamentalist Christians have consistently been the only group who choose to name-call and threaten us with damnation. They are the only ones who have monopolized the righteousness of God and railed against my family form as immoral (not just impractical). When I write about my-experience I do share this fact.

Others who write for the newsletter seem to have had similar experiences. They describe them in their own stories. Most people in the network who list their spiritual or religious choices, as you noted, are not Christian (although some are). I think most, if they were inclined to look, would find it difficult to locate a Christian church that will accept love in the polyfidelitous form.

The majority of Christian religions I am aware of hold a perspective on sexuality that decidedly does not overlap much with that of someone who is polyfidelitous. Why even this summer, when the National Prespyterian Church Committee turned in a report that stated that it was basically okay for humans to have sex, it was rejected!

Instead, this Protestant church said that ideas like homosexual sex being as acceptable as heterosexual sex, celibacy not being the only moral choice for singles, and sex prior to marriage being moral when based on maturity and consent were wrong. And beyond that it said they were sins against God.

I do realize that some Christians base their participation in religions like this on Jesus' actual teachings. Since the main thrust of his work was to promote love and acceptance, it would seem that Christians would exemplify these characteristics. Unfortunately this is frequently not the case. In general, monotheists see their personal God, their personal mythology as the only way. Non-believers are seen as evil enemies.

I am very happy to hear that you are a Christian and you are interested in polyfidelity. Perhaps through your unique position you can be part of opening more hearts to love and acceptance of varying family forms and styles of loving. It is definitely PEP's desire to support each person's right to the spiritual view of her/his choice. At the same time, it is our duty to reject groups which deny our right to live as we choose.

Specific Definitions

Dear PEP, Karl Hess points out to libertarians that you can't have a voluntary market outside of the context of voluntary association. Therefore, if you truly want to promote a voluntary marketplace, you must first work to create a form of voluntary association. To assert that you want something to come about while failing to facilitate the necessary preconditions is to delude yourself.

My point is that this process applies equally well to polyfidelity. The world at large will never accept us; therefore if we truly desire the evolution of polyfidelitous relationships, we must work to create contexts in which they can flourish. You simply won't get the result without first achieving the context. There's a wonderfully relevant saying in baseball that points out that you can't steal first base.

The article *Ganas Update* in the spring issue of *Loving More*, was perhaps one of the most important pieces I've ever seen

in a PEP publication. Here's why: if someone wants to proceed in this direction, more provocation is pointless. What they need is practical guidance on how to proceed. The Ganas gang comes under the heading of "them what's doin'," a much too small fraternity. Their pathfinding activities can serve two very important functions. The first is to show hopefuls a possible path to achieve their objectives. The second service is to show people who may never have had a polyfidelitous thought that the concept is both desirable and possible. There is nothing so radical as a working model.

While the Ganas organization as a whole isn't polyfidelitous, there's no doubt that they have a polyfidelitous core, protected and enhanced by surrounding layers of supportive people. There's a very important principle here. While their scope may fall short of being "politically correct," at least they're getting on with a working system that's definitely heading in a good direction.

English lacks a word that describes Ganas, but other cultures are familiar with the form. The correct term is a keiretsu, often translated as "shaped like a wedding cake." Ganas is one, and so too is Windward, my home. Their description could well serve to describe us. The precise differences between the two groups, while fascinating to those of us involved hands-on, are perhaps too subtle to be of interest to casual readers, but the knowledge that there is an alternative concept that works is great news to anyone with the wits to realize that there has to be a better way. Where there's one answer, there can also be others.

You're probably wondering where the objection comes in. The Ganas author was considerate enough to present the caveat that Ganas was not perhaps the form of polyfidelity that your readers might have in mind; that was commendable. It's unfortunate that it was used as the occasion for an editorial cheap shot. The comment was witty and sharp, and out of place. An editorial insertion is appropriate in some rare cases, but here it served no purpose beyond exercising the editor's ego.

A group of people such as Ganas, or Windward, represent a long-term, sincere attempt to do what so many say can't be done. We need exposure, both to attract new spirits and to help expand the consciousness of alternative lifestyles, but that exposes us to a remarkable range of misinterpretations, and once it's in print, you spend time and credibility explaining that things aren't really that way, they're like this. It's amazing how hard it is for people to believe that something they've seen in print is less real than what they're actually told by the people involved. It's very scary to realize that no matter how hard we work to define ourselves, a careless editor can override us and dash our credibility. -WASHINGTON

Aloha, I'm glad you found the Ganas article so significant, but I'm sorry you read so much into my editorial clarification in that article. Here is a repeat of the section of the article in question: "Many of us are either in monogamous or open couples. The rest engage in the whole range of social practices usual for single people. We are sometimes thought of as polyfidelitous, but probably don't qualify for the title. (Editor's note: They're right, they don't.)"

While this may seem like a "witty," "sharp," "editorial cheap shot" to you, to me it was simply agreeing with what the author herself indicated and emphasizing that the relationship styles described are not polyfidelitous. I feel as editor of a newsletter focused on polyfidelity, it is certainly important for me to see that the word is used accurately in this publication. My comment was simply intended to be as brief and direct as possible.

I think you and I agree that the Ganas community is a wonderful example of people living an alternative. This is precisely why I printed the article they wrote, and why I published one by them a couple years back. This is how I show my support for these pioneers. However, I feel I would be doing them a disservice if I did not clarify the fact that polyfidelity is a very specific form of group marriage, not a community of people who are monogamous, singles, and open couples as they describe themselves.

Perhaps you have noticed how often the

definition of polyfidelity is included in this newsletter. If you read the Polyfidelity Primer you will find several pages complete with diagrams all intended to help people understand what the word polyfidelity means. Unfortunately, as a new word, many people use it incorrectly. A word has power only when it has specific meaning and is used accurately. If I use the word "cat" for every animal I see, it becomes much less useful for communicating than if I use it only for the specific animal that is actually a cat. In the same way, I will continue to correct the use of the word polyfidelity anytime I see it used inaccurately. No offense intended.

For those who'd like a review of the definition of the word polyfidelity: POLYFIDEL-ITY: A specific form of equalitarian group marriage including more than 2 spouses; A group in which all partners are primary to all other partners as demonstrated by actions such as sharing a strong emotional bond, home space & resources, and making important life decisions together equally; As a marriage, sexual relationships exist between all partners in line with their sexual preference (i.e. in a heterosexual group every man and every woman would be lovers, in a lesbian group all the women would be lovers with each other woman, etc.); sexual fidelity is to the group; and all partners share an intent of a lifelong commitment together. (Please see pages 9-11 of the Polyfidelity Primer published by PEP for contrasts with other relationship forms.)

Two Book Reviews

More than One

A Home at the End of the World by Michael Cunningham (published by Farrar Straus Girous, New York 1990)

Fiction which can echo or flesh out the subtleties and nuances of multi-adult bonding is rare. While this book begins with dysfunctional family life and compensatory friendships, it does spend part of its time describing and detailing life as a threesome.

Bobby and Jonathan begin as young friends who eventually explore their sexuality together. Their relationship is emotionally deep, and Jonathan, an orphan of sorts, becomes enmeshed in Bobby's bio-family life. After high school Jonathan goes off to NYC and a disconnected homosexual lifestyle. But he also creates a homelife with a woman, Clare, in a shared rental. They become emotionally intimate and talk of having a child together, despite their sexual preference differences.

Then Bobby shows up and takes his place amidst their twosome. As a group they consistently feel and function like "family." So Clare makes it with Bobby, who has been celibate for years, and produces the desired child. Despite their uncomfortability at their

unconventional dynamics, they all love each other and live together as a triad with a young child. They move from the city, endure parent's deaths, and start a business together.

Like most contemporary novels, the characters seem to spend little to no time working out their psychological problems or improving their interpersonal communication skills. I guess that'd be too much to ask. And basically, the story is none too perky or positive, but the three person relating comes across authentically enough to be pleasurable.

Good Faith and Truthful Ignorance by Alexandra Parma Cook and Noble David Cook (published by Duke University Press)

Through much historical research, the authors have pieced together the story of Francisco Noguerol de Ulloa who fled Spain for the New World, in part to get away from an unhappy marriage. With communication so poor back in the 16th century, when he is misinformed that his first wife back home is dead, Francisco immediately weds a new wife. Upon arriving in Spain with this new wife, he's charged with bigamy by the King and gets embroiled in a giant legal battle. Eventually it takes the decree of Pope Paul IV to settle the matter. Imagine living in times like these, and be glad you're here now!

"Polyfidelity is a social institution that appeals to people whose nature is too gregarious to fit into nuclear family or loner lifestyles. It combines the trust and intimacy found in good traditional marriages with the variety and liveliness found in the open lifestyle. Although this choice has only come into its own in the past 20 years among a very limited population, it has features which may well make it a very popular lifestyle in years to come, as social and cultural evolution continue. Certainly it is a model that may be well suited to new endeavors such as colonizing the space frontier (sending out polyfidelitous clusters of best friends who function as both work groups and intimate families for long-term missions could bypass many of the problems associated with loneliness and sexual frustration such missions might otherwise encounter). More than its sci-fi applications, however, polyfidelity is a lifestyle that will appeal to sexually active singles who are tired of superficial sexual involvements (and worried about the risks of non-fidelitous affairs) on one hand, and unable to feel satisfied and fulfilled inside monogamy. The biggest single factor impeding its growth right now is ignorance. The vast majority of people have never even heard of the idea, and if they did hear of it, would assume it couldn't work due to jealousy, possessiveness, and other supposedly insurmountable obstacles within human nature. The fact that it does work is one of the best kept secrets around." —Bluejay Way in RockHEAD
