The negotiations in the recent dispute between the OMA and the Ministry of Health, Government of Ontario, did not meet an acceptable standard of fairness, efficiency and concern for the public welfare.

The MEDICAL REFORM GROUP OF ONTARIO believes this dispute reflected many problems in the relationship between physicicans and their represented bodies and the government, including the lack of clarity as to the role and responsibility of the physicians' bodies, the failure to follow any traditional bargaining practice and the confusion as to whether doctors are public employees or private business people.

Prior to the next government-OMA fee negotiations, doctors through their organizations such as the OMA and the CPSO <u>must</u> clearly define themselves for the purpose of these negotiations. The MRG believes that:

- doctors can remain a self governing independent profession negotiating as a voluntary association of small business people or
- 2) doctors can move toward union status including that of employee relationship with government, signed contracts, sacrifice of self-government, and other traditional features of labour unions.

PHYSICIANS CANNOT HAVE THE BEST OF BOTH WORLDS.

Once doctors have determined their own status, they must act according to established business or labour practices, with their respective benefits and disadvantages.

The ultimate goal must be for the government and the OMA to develop a clear and equitable bargaining process for fee disputes, a mechanism for the prompt resolution of disputes in the event of a breakdown in negotiations, with a settlement binding on both parties.
