Raya Dunayevskaya, political analyst and philosopher, is the author of Marxism and Freedom ... From 1776 Until Today; Nationalism, Communism, Marzist-Humanism and the Afro-Asian Revolutions; Philosophy and Revolution, from Hegel to Sartre and from Marx to Mao (now being translated into Italian and Spanish); Notes on Women's Liberation: Women as Reason and Revolutionary Force. She has also published in Presence Africaine, China Monthly, The American Review, and Erich Fromm's international symposium, Socialist Humanism. A one-time secretary to the famous Leon Trotsky, she broke with him because of her insistence that Russia was not a workers' state. She has lectured at many universities — California, Columbia, Chicago, Wisconsin, Edinburgh, Cambridge, Leeds, Tokyo, Kyoto, among others—on such topics as Marxist Humanism, Africa, the Black Revolt in America, and the Challenge of Mao Tse-tung. Recently she lectured at the Hegel Society of America Conference.
