Dear Bartelli,

Why it would take the P/O. 7 days to deliver a letter to Det. from NY, only you (who write much more briefly than I) may be able to philosophise on its inefficiency. I was glad to get yours of the 10th with the invitation to be on your 1-hour radio program WBAI. I assumed you would not conduct the interview by looking at the clock every 5 minutes. This is the centenary of Marx's final writings that have been very nearly as greatly dismissed as when they had not been transcribed till the early 1970s. Moreover, it is, along with what I call, using Hegel's dialectic expression "new moments", and adding that these "new moments" leave a trail to the 1980s. Perhaps our generation, as against most others from Engels down or up, as you wish, can recreate and expand those moments. Whether it is a question of the Accumulation of Capital theory, or Women's Liberation, or Third World or "revolution in permanence" (not to be confused with Trotsky's permanent revolution theory) the interview, if it is to be had, must have time to express both the comprehensiveness and the challenge to post-Marx Marxists. O/k?

I do not know the precise places and times I speak in NY before I'm off, first to D.C. where I address the Iranian exiles, and then throughout the country so that I'm not to return to Detroit till 1st week in May. Please call Kevin Anderson who is the one responsible for scheduling my talks, and he will arrange it with you:

Thank you for sending me some of your recent writings. All I can do is include Humanities Press brochure on my books; because they accepted the idea that, this being the Marx centenary and I having spent 30 years as an independent Marxist, they should not only publish my latest work, ROSA LUXEMBURG, WOMEN'S LIBERATION AND MARX'S PHILOSOPHY OF REVOLUTION, but also reprint, with new introductions, MARXISM AND FREEDOM and PHILOSOPHY AND REVOLUTION. Have you been getting NEWS & LETTERS and seen my latest on Andropov?
